But between those verses, we're told "the length of our days is seventy years - or eighty, if we have the strength; yet their span is but trouble and sorrow, for they quickly pass, and we fly away (verse 10)".

And our life experiences show us that what Scripture teaches is true. I love life. I love God's good creation. But I'm also grateful to know that this is not as good as it gets.

The writer of Hebrews tells us that even as Abraham entered the Promised Land, "he was looking forward to the city with foundations, whose architect and builder is God" (11.10).

From the Senior Pastor...

The scale of the event captivates our attention, causing our minds to spin with questions whose answers still leave us uncomfortable.

I've never seen anything, in person or on tape, that compares to the scenes of water rushing ashore, smashing everything in its path, leaving in its wake scattered remnants of cars, boats, houses, and people.

Where is God? Is this His doing? Is this part of His plan?

Of course, if it isn't, we're really in trouble. For that would mean that we were caught in the grinding forces of blind chance, with God looking on from the outside hoping, along with the rest of us, that everything turns out for the best.

It is not easy to answer the question of how Japan's recent history is part of God's good, eternal plan. But to deny what Scripture clearly teaches — "I form light and create darkness, I bring prosperity and create disaster; I, the LORD, do all these things" (Isa 45.7) — is to be left with questions even more difficult to answer.

In truth, each of our lives are impacted by earthquakes and tsunamis. They may

not be talked about on Fox News, or commented upon by Brian Williams, but the intensity of the hurt, pain and confusion is greater than events unfolding in far away Japan.

My brother was run over by a truck and killed. Linda and I have lost a baby. Linda's sister carried her child for nine months, only for the child to be still-born. My Dad died of cancer. My cousin was murdered. My mother and in-laws are growing feeble. As a pastor I've known more heartache than I care to recite.

Each of you could tell your own story. It's the reality of living life in a fallen world. Scripture doesn't lie to us. Sometimes we lie to ourselves. Sometimes we're selective about the verses we choose to read and those we choose not to read.

For example Psalm 90 begins with a wonderful declaration of faith and confidence: "The Lord has been our dwelling place for all generations." It closes with this prayer: "O Lord . . . satisfy us in the morning with your unfailing love, that we may sing for joy and be glad all our days."
